What is AIRPOWER19?

AIRPOWER19 is an event for the whole family. It showcases over 200 civil and military aircraft from 20 nations, including 50 aircraft from the Federal Armed Forces and the historic Flying Bulls squadron.

AIRPOWER19 is a meeting place for aviation fans from around the world. It is being held on the 6th and 7th September from 9am to 5pm (admission from 7am, close at 7pm) at the Federal Armed Forces Airbase in Zeltweg, Styria. Around 300,000 spectators are expected.

Who is organising AIRPOWER19?

AIRPOWER19 is being organised by the Austrian Federal Armed Forces and its partners Land Steiermark (Province of Styria) and Red Bull.

How much is AIRPOWER19 admission?

Admission is free, as in previous years.

What measures are in place to ensure visitor safety?

Safety is paramount at AIRPOWER19, especially spectator safety. This means, for example, that certain items are prohibited on the AIRPOWER19 site for the protection of visitors. There will be security checks at the entrance. More detailed information can be found on the AIRPOWER19 homepage.

What are the highlights of AIRPOWER19?

Here are just a few:

- The Austrian Air Force's **realistic mission demonstrations** will display almost all of their aircraft and helicopter types in both the exhibition on the ground (static display) and in the air (flying display). Of course, the Eurofighters and Black Hawk helicopters will also be there.
- Demonstrations of aerial combat from the First World War to today with the original aircraft from the respective era is especially exciting.
- The Red Bull Aerobatic Triple: a show involving helicopters (BO 105 C), aircraft (Edge 540), and four skydivers together in the sky. The unique choreography of the Flying Bulls, the Red Bull Skydive Team, and the parachutists of the HSV

Red Bull Salzburg will be a first for pilots and spectators, as this maneuver has never been seen in Europe.

- The historic Flying Bulls squadron.
- The demonstrations by top European aerobatic teams and regular AIRPO-WER guests Frecce Tricolori, Patrouille Suisse, Patrulla Águila, and many more.
- The Static Display with **exceptional aircraft** from the worlds of combat aircraft, transport aircraft, helicopters, and historic aircraft.
- The **exhibition area** for training, research, and teaching (for details see site plan on page 8/9)
- The Military Aviation Museum takes you on a journey through over one hundred years of Austrian military aviation history.

What is the AIRPOWER19 slogan?

AIRPOWER19's slogan is "We're plane crazy about Austria". This slogan is intended to provide all partners, participants, and spectators with a platform to emphasise their commitment to aviation and Austria.

How should visitors get to AIRPOWER19?

Public transport is the best option. It is stress-free, there are no traffic jams, and it is environmentally friendly. 45 free special trains commute between Kraubath and Zeltweg at 10-15 minutes intervals on both days. There are also 14 free buses between Fisching and Zeltweg.

The Military Aviation Museum takes you on a journey through Austrian Federal Armed Forces aviation history.

Founded in 2005 as a military aviation exhibition for the 50th anniversary of the Federal Armed Forces, 25 proud iron eagles line up on the 5,000 square metre Military Aviation Museum site. They are displayed wing to wing – from the first aircraft in Austrian service, a Yakovlev Yak-18, to the still well-known Saab 305E Draken.

Also on board: the Fouga CM 170 Magister, De Havilland DH-115 Vampire, Saab J-29F Flying Ton, and the Agusta Bell 204. In addition to fixed-wing aircraft and helicopters, aviation enthusiasts can visit a simulator, see aircraft engines, jet engines, antiaircraft guns, radars, aviation equipment, air force uniforms and equipment, numerous billboards and photographs on various military aviation topics in Austria. All this, as with all displays at AIRPOW-ER19, of course completely free of charge.
